This Resource Guide is a comprehensive listing of all members of GVOAD, their up-to-date Point of Contact information, and the services/resources they can supply during an evolving disaster in Georgia. Please utilize this guide to assist you in future disaster support.

#### **Georgia VOAD Mission**

GVOAD is a humanitarian association of independent voluntary organizations who may be active in all phases of disaster. Its mission is to foster efficient, streamlined service delivery to people affected by disaster, while minimizing unnecessary duplication of effort, through cooperation in the four phases of disaster: preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation.

#### Georgia VOAD Purpose

Prior to GVOAD's existence, volunteer agencies and organizations involved in disaster response worked totally independent of one another. GVOAD remedied this apparent gap, focusing its efforts on "the four Cs" – **Cooperation, Coordination, Communication, and Collaboration**, striving to minimize duplication and gaps in service.

GVOAD provides a forum for members to establish vital relationships with other nongovernment, government agencies at all levels, and individuals, allowing for assistance to disasters that will be quicker, smoother, involve relevant stakeholders, better manage affiliated and non-affiliated or spontaneous volunteers, and ultimately enhance beneficial effects for survivors. Additionally, GVOAD provides regular meetings, special training, and educational opportunities for its members.

#### **Georgia VOAD Members**

GVOAD members have a proven and documented focus, scope, and purpose to support disasters throughout Georgia or in a particular area or region within Georgia. Through its member organizations, GVOAD plays an integral role in assisting disaster survivors, without discrimination, throughout the state. GVOAD will continue to provide this crucial assistance in times of disaster and is committed to expanding its member network through outreach and information sharing.

#### Georgia VOAD Relationships

GVOAD's partnership with local Emergency Managers, GEMA and FEMA provides the necessary link between government agencies and the volunteer organizations active in disasters. We offer guidance to develop a local or Community Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD), training to create Long-Term Recovery Committees, and when requested, GVOAD has trained representatives that report to the GEMA State Operation Center and to FEMA Joint Field Office.

**Disaster Resources:** AFS transports 10 flights/day + assists in nearly all national disasters (including COVID-19); generators, medical supplies, planes

**Volunteers: Apply <u>HERE</u>**. COVID-19 screening required. **Must be** Instrument Rated Pilot. Volunteers provided with badge to access tarmac issue-free.

**Disaster Resources:** Pickup truck, SUV, van; amateur communication devices (radios + walkies), chainsaws, hand tools, lighting, mobile feeding units, tarps, yard tools

Volunteers: Background check required. Must obtain CPR certification + pass FEMA IS courses (100, 235 244, 700). No age restrictions. Spontaneous accepted.

\*Medical equipment awarded as temporary, long-term loans

Dog Restrictions: Must be 18 months old, a member of a recognized pet therapy program for at least 12 months and have 12 verifiable visits within the last year. Handler and dog must complete screening evaluation + training workshop.

Volunteers: 18+ only. Required → completion of Dog Behavior trainings, FEMA IS courses, Human and Pet First Aid & CPR, and Psychological First Aid course.

Spontaneous not accepted.

**Disaster Resources:** Mobile command centers, semitrailers, service trucks; emergency communication devices, satellite dishes, workspaces

Volunteers: 18+ only. 25 to drive. Mandatory training course (ITDRC-100) + background check. Interest form.

Volunteers: Packing events held biweekly (dependent on need), handled onsite at distribution center in Brunswick, GA. Training and background check **not** required.

### **Primary Disaster Services:**

- Food Service: Hot Foods, Non-Perishable Foods: Canned foods not a priority but possible
  - → Operates on mass scale: Capable of providing <u>15,000</u> meals daily to meet needs of a devastated community

**Disaster Resources:** Communication devices (radios and walkies), generators, mobile kitchen (x6), mobile distribution vehicle (x1), refrigerated truck (x1), tarps, trucks for pulling kitchens, water filtration devices

**Volunteers:** Specific training for food prep & safe practices, disaster awareness, and basic safety. **Must be 16+** to work in kitchen. Background check required *if* working with children.







- Financial Assistance: Typically non-perishables or gift cards (funds limited)
- Health and Medical Support: Welfare Inquiries
- Vulnerable Population Support: Special Needs Care
- Transportation Services
